'peaking' power generation plant on open agricultural land off Stainburn Road. The development had been opposed by both the Town Council and the neighbouring parish council of Great Clifton.

Resolved: That a letter be composed by the Town Clerk to the Secretary of State to express its concerns about the nature of the development and the way in which local decision-making has been ignored. Allerdale Borough Council and Great Clifton Parish Council should be consulted on the content of the letter.
